ACQUISITION: Mark Holaday donated his father's collection of World War II era memorabilia on April 2, 2011.

ACCESS: Restricted access; materials fragile; access by request at Akron-Summit County Public Library's Main Library Special Collections division only.

VOLUME: 1 manuscript box, 1 artifact box, flag display case and mounted awards, 2.5 linear ft.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE: Ralph Holaday (1925-1995) was the optician/owner of Summit Optical Co. in Akron, Ohio and served in the U.S. Navy during World War II. Mr. Holaday served as a signalman on the USS Bronstein during World War II. The Bronstein sank 3 German U-boats and helped to transfer gold ingots owned by the Polish Government from Africa to the United States.

SCOPE AND CONTENT: This collection is comprised of material relating to Ralph Holaday's World War II service in the US Navy. He served as a signalman on the USS Bronstein.

ARRANGEMENT: The collection is arranged into 8 series by item type.
